Police chief cited for parking violation

As part of Kent Shuebrook's duties as Amity Township police chief, he presents reports about police activity to the township supervisors at their public meetings.

At Wednesday night's meeting, the report included a confession of sorts along with information that police had issued 67 citations for vehicles left parked on streets during last week's major snowstorm.

"I must inform you that one of the citations the department issued was to one of my vehicles," Shuebrook said. "It was appropriately issued for not taking my car off the street as the township's ordinance requires.

"It's something I did, was cited for it and will have to pay for."

Not all those cited felt the same. The supervisors said they had gotten complaints about the tickets, but they weren't moved by them.

"This is something that causes a real problem for our snow removal operations, and it's a good thing that the police are out there enforcing it," Supervisor Terry Jones said.

The fine in Amity for leaving a vehicle on the street during a snow emergency is \$15.
