

Recycling contract extended

The Amity Township supervisors have chosen to extend their contract for recycling services with J.P. Mascaro & Sons, with only a slight increase in cost.

The annual cost will increase about \$1,200 to \$220,602 from \$219,402.

"Overall, we've been satisfied with the recycling service," supervisors Chairman Bob Yanos said.

He did ask two Mascaro representatives who attended the meeting Wednesday about the abundance of plastic milk bottles that must be recycled.

"It seems like a pretty simple thing to crush the bottle before putting it out for recycling," Yanos said. "It takes up less space and is less likely to blow off the truck, but a lot of people just don't do it."

The board also voted to add a left-turn signal to the stop light on Maplewood Avenue at Route 422 West at a cost of approximately \$5,500.
