

Several employees will learn how to direct traffic

Amity Township will spend \$842 to train and certify several of its employees to safely direct traffic on public roads.

The training will be provided to meet a requirement of the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation.

"You have to be trained and certified if you're going to be directing traffic on a public road," public works foreman Ali Howell-Clarke told the township supervisors Wednesday night. "It's required by the state for anybody who works on the roads."

The training, according to Howell-Clarke, is aimed at traffic safety.

"They'll be going over the do's and don'ts when you're out on the road directing traffic," he said.

Howell-Clarke said that approximately 18 township employees, including four police supervisors, will undergo the training on township property within the next 90 days.

The certifications will be good for three years.
