



## Board rescinds letter to Amity



The Exeter Township supervisors agreed Monday to rescind a letter expressing their disapproval of an industrial park proposed in neighboring Amity Township.

Amity hopes to work with Exeter and St. Lawrence to get the regional comprehensive plan changed to rezone the area where they want to create the industrial park for mixed uses.

Exeter had concerns over traffic and safety issues but they were resolved in a half-hour joint meeting with Amity officials last week.

"I had no idea that the plan was conceptual, or what state it was in, so I am glad we brought it to their attention," Supervisor Michelle P. Kirchner said.

Supervisor Gary E. Lloyd disagreed.

"We shouldn't have caused a big stink like that not knowing all the facts," he said.

Also at Monday's meeting, the board voted to authorize Reading Country Club Golf Course managers to spend no more than \$420,000 for a computerized irrigation system.

Managers said that the self-watering system would save time and money, and eventually increase revenue at the golf course.

And the board is giving the Mehadrin Kosher Poultry Plant two weeks to pay an outstanding fourth-quarter sewer bill so it can investigate the cause of increased sewage flows and charges. If the plant's owner pays on time, it can save up to 20 percent of the bill, which tops \$100,000.
