

Residents to pay for replacement bins

The Amity Township supervisors have voted 5-0 to charge residents to replace recycling bins that are lost or damaged if it is the residents' fault.

The charge will be \$16 for bins with lids and \$12.50 for bins without, the same prices the township pays.

After an executive session at the meeting Wednesday, the board voted unanimously to make Officer John Coe a permanent member of the police force.

Supervisors Chairman Robert Yanos said Coe, a Marine Corps veteran, had successfully completed his one-year probationary period.

Township Manager Charles E. Lyon informed the supervisors that recreation board member Risa Marmontello was going to give up her seat next year when her term expires.

Lyon said Marmontello has served on the board for 11 1/2 years and is going to step down for personal reasons.
